Playing beyond CLIL continues the excellent work of Playing CLIL, where both teachers and students discovered that learning through play provided unexpected opportunities to assess both content and language.

SHOW WHAT YOU KNOW events are designed to offer students alternative ways of demonstrating their understanding of subjects, giving teachers an entertaining opportunity to assess.

During the course SWYK events are introduced, modelled and practised. Each SWTK is accompanied with guidance and activities on how to prepare students and connect relevant subject content.

The central concepts of 'languaging' and 'deep learning' are explored and developed in the context of each SWYK.

Target Audience

Teacher trainers, heads of department, subject teachers and language teachers in established CLIL teaching environments. Language teachers and subject teachers in non-CLIL education.



Objectives

At the end of the course, participants will be able to Play Beyond CLIL!

From understanding the project theories principles they will be able to promote the use of SHOW WHAT YOU KNOW events in their schools and educational communities. They will have the competences to train colleagues in How to Show What You Know across the curriculum in their school.

They will develop resources and activities which will contribute to the development of the pupils' thinking skills and their personal growth in line with the national curriculum. Participants will learn how to develop the SWYK process as a resource to deepen and complement structured learning.

Participants will be invited to take part in data collection on behalf of the project.

Methodology

Multifaceted presentational styles combing introduction of concepts and theories using multimedia resources with workshops and seminars. The course is practical and much will be learning ethorough modelling and playing.



Course Fee

The total cost of the course is 1.300 €, payable after receipt of the Erasmus plus grant. The course fee covers:
